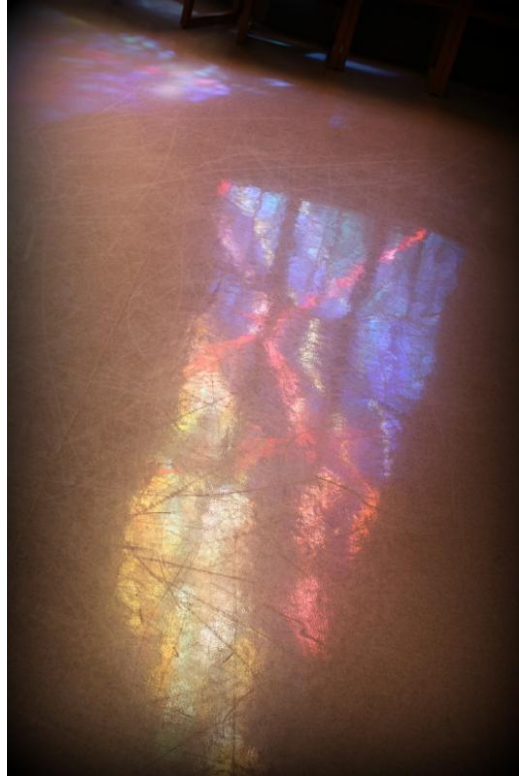


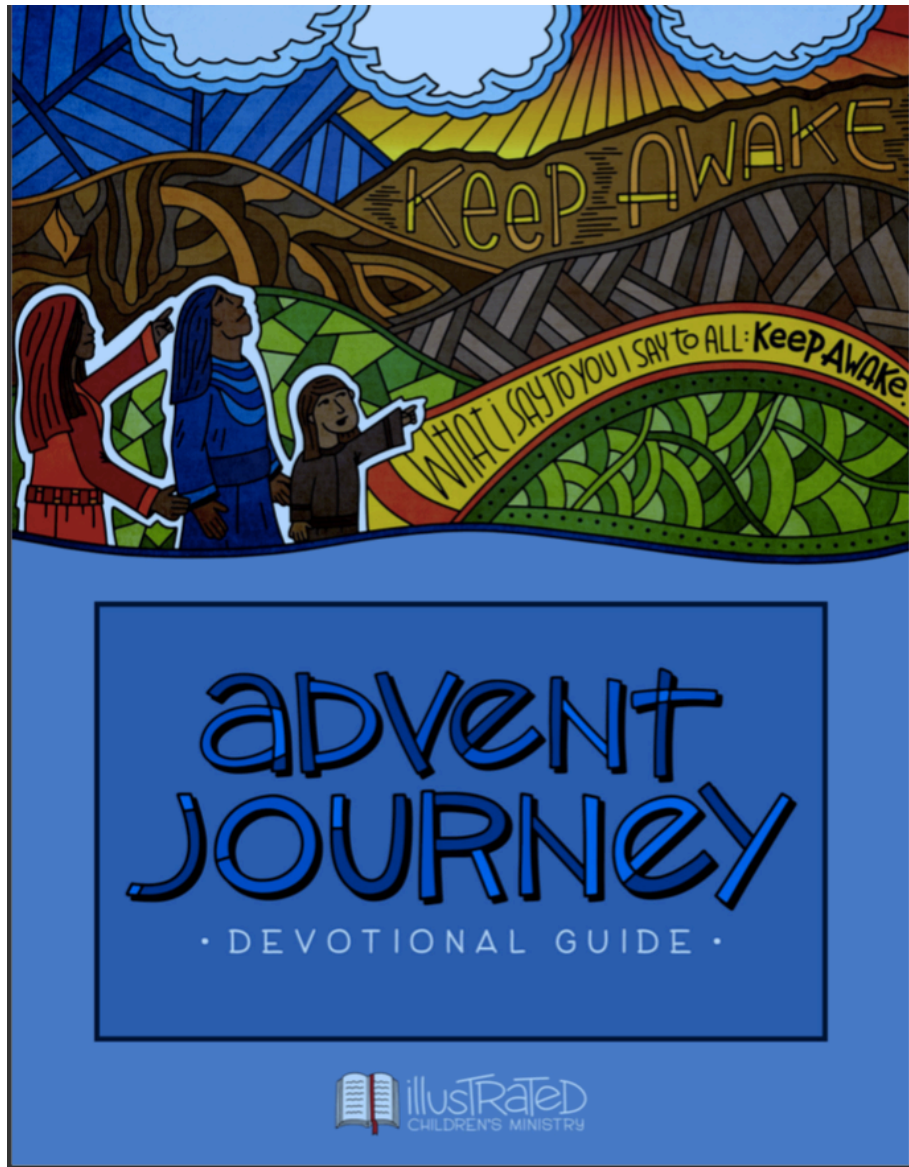
# Advent 2017 at The Episcopal Church of ST. John the Baptist.

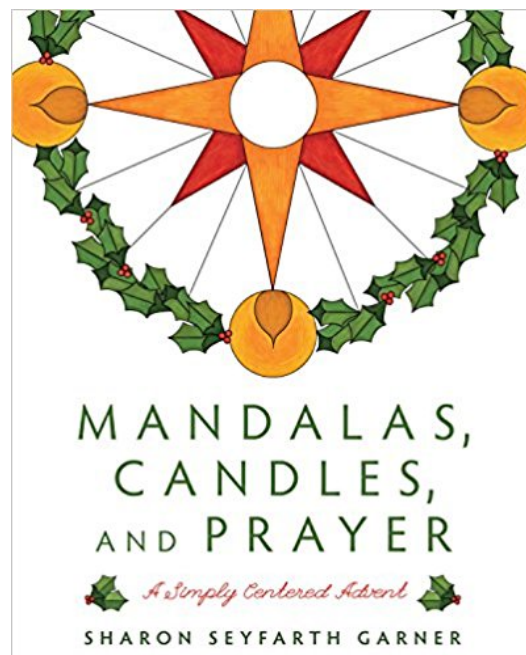

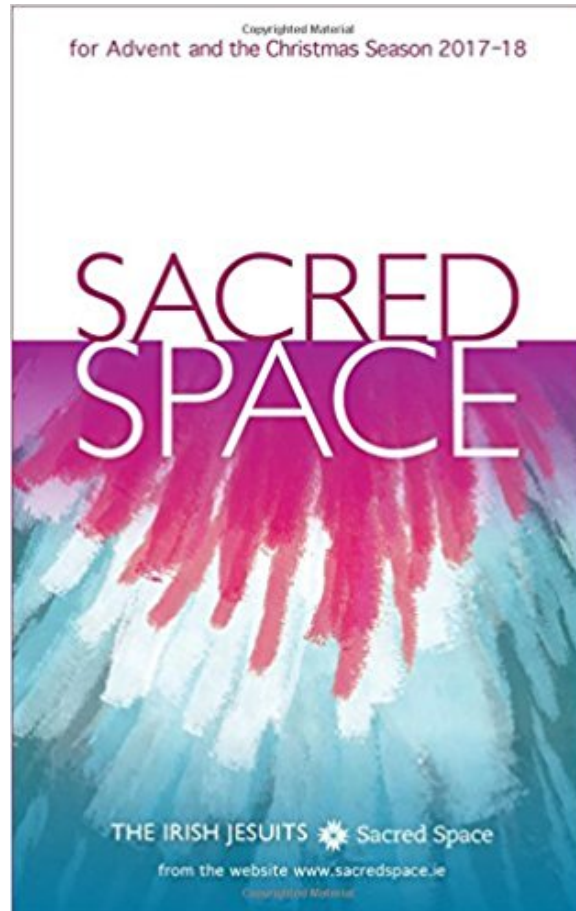
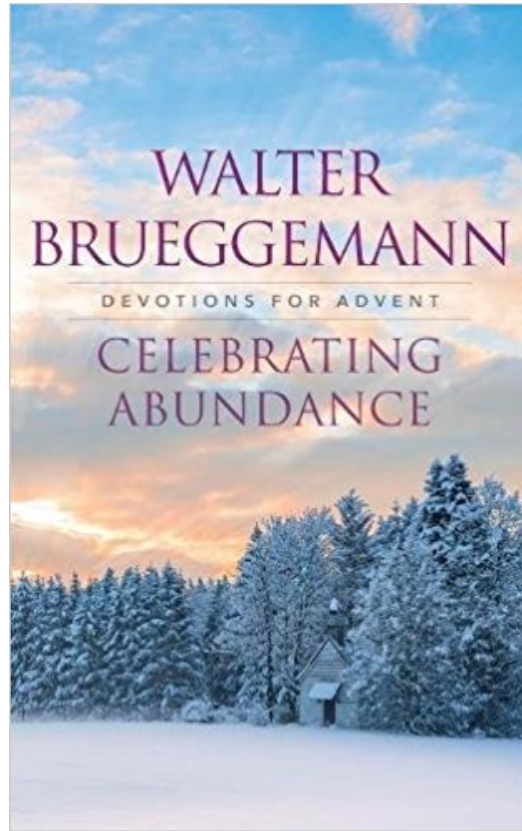
share without having the public read it. Rev. Sue will be the moderator for this group.
