StJB Portrait of Rebecca Marie Phippen Dow (1783-1875) The Church of St. John the Baptist was built in 1876-7 in honor of "our" Rebecca Maria Phippen Dow, a Sanbornville (then Wolfeborough Junction) resident for all of her adult life, mother of 14 children and devout Christian, by her tenth child, Harriette Dow and her and grand-daughter (through a younger daughter), Harriette Low. Through a long-ago gift of the Dow/Low families, StJB is the proud possessor of Rebecca Maria's portrait, in oil! Unfortunately, the years have not been kind to it. 


